The portfolio included Community Rehab, which was later acquired by Horizon Healthcare Corporation, the first acquisition of a therapy rehabilitation provider by one of the largest nursing home operators in the U.S. Duke began his career in the U.S. Air Force Strategic Air Command and then moved into technology management with electronics companies including Advanced Cash Register, Lundy Electronics, and Sharp Electronics.

One of Duke's companies, Community Rehabilitation, was featured in the *Dallas Ft. Worth Business Journal* as the 2nd fastest growing company in the DFW Metroplex. Beyond his business achievements, Duke is a former President of the DFW Senior Olympics and a former member of the AMA's Presidents Association. He holds two patents related to a mobile integrated patient care system. Duke is also a private collector of fine art focusing on 19th and 20th century Western art.
